The Cowboys scored 35 points in the season-opening win over the Giants, the 16th time they have surpassed 30 points in the season-opening game. Dallas has never lost when scoring 30-plus points in the first game of the season, posting a 15-0-1 record.

Player Spotlight

4 DAK PRESCOTT

★ Dak Prescott recorded a perfect passer rating (158.3), completing 25-of-32 passes for 405 yards and four touchdowns to become only the second Cowboys quarterback to record a perfect passer rating in team history, joining Craig Morton. He is also one-of-four players in NFL history to record a game with 400 passing yards, four passing touchdowns and a perfect passer rating:

★ Additionally, Prescott joined Lamar Jackson as the only quarterbacks in NFL history with perfect passer ratings (158.3) in a season opener (min 20 attempts), with both players accomplishing the feat in 2019.

★ Prescott became the first player in Cowboys history to have 400+ passing yards and four-plus passing touchdowns in a win. A big part of Prescott's day was the deep ball, completing five passes of 25+ yards - fifth in a single-game in team history and most in a season-opener. The big plays boosted his yards-per-attempt to 12.66, the highest single-game average of his career and the sixth-highest single-game average in Cowboys history (minimum 25 attempts)

SCOUTING REPORT



7 The Washington defense forced seven negative yardage plays in Week 1, including six rushes for negative yards. This put the opposing offense behind the chains and led to six third down attempts from 10-plus yards. Dallas meanwhile, stayed ahead of the chains and had only two third down attempts from 10-plus yards in Week 1.

20+ The Washington defense was susceptible to the big play in Week 1 of 2019, allowing three plays of 20+ yards and two big-play touchdowns. This is an area where Dallas showed a vast improvement thus far in 2019, beating the Giants for seven plays of 20-plus yards and three big-play touchdowns in Week 1.

176 The Cowboys recorded 176 yards after the catch (YAC) against the Giants in Week 1, the sixth-highest total from the first week of 2019. Meanwhile, the Redskins only allowed 99 yards after the catch in their first game, the seventh-lowest figure.

★ TOP FINISHES ★

★ HEAD COACHES ★

JASON GARRETT (78-59, 9th Year)

Jason Garrett was named the eighth head coach in Dallas Cowboys history on January 5, 2011. Garrett became the first former Cowboys player to become the team's head coach. As a backup quarterback during his playing career in Dallas, he started nine-of-23 games played and was a member of teams that won six division titles and three Super Bowl championships.

Garrett was elevated to the Cowboys top job after taking over as the team's interim head coach midway through 2010. He guided the club to a 5-3 mark to finish the season after the team started 1-7. He led Dallas to an 8-8 record, narrowly missing the playoffs and an NFC East Division title in each his first three full seasons as head coach (2011-13). Garrett guided the 2014 squad to an NFL-best tying 12-4 record, the club's 22nd Division title - 18th NFC East title - 31st postseason appearance and 34th playoff win. His team fought through adversity in 2015, slipping to 4-12 on the season. The team bounced back under Garrett in 2016, completing the club's largest one-season turnaround in franchise history with a nine-game difference, finishing with a 13-3 record in 2016. The record included beginning the season 0-1 and going on to win 11 straight games - the longest single-season win streak in team history. Garrett's Cowboys won their second division championship with him at the helm, while earning the NFC's top overall seed and hosting an NFC Divisional Playoff Game for the first time since 2007. He was named AP Coach of the Year for his team's 2016 accomplishments. The 2018 Cowboys finished 10-6, making the playoffs for the fourth time in Garrett's tenure, and giving them three consecutive winning seasons for the first time since 2007-09.

From 2007-13, when Garrett was brought on board as the Cowboys offensive coordinator, the unit finished among the NFL's top-10 in total offense in five of his seven years at the helm: 2013 (10th), 2012 (6th), 2010 (10th), 2009 (2nd) and 2007 (2nd). The team has set single-season records in a handful of categories, including topping 6,000 net yards for the first four times in franchise history (2009- 6,390; 2011 - 6,008; 2014 - 6,138 and 2016 - 6,027). Since his arrival in 2007, the club's cumulative numbers for gross passing yards (39,993) and total points (3,919) represent the best totals over a 10-year span in the history of the organization while the club's 58,567 total net yards are second.

JAY GRUDEN (35-45-1, 6th Year)

Jay Gruden is in his sixth season with the Washington Redskins in 2019 after being named the 29th head coach in franchise history on January 9, 2014. Previously a decorated quarterback in the college and Arena Football League ranks, and as a successful NFL assistant, Gruden has showcased his offensive acumen honed from his diverse football background throughout his tenure with the Redskins.

In 2018 the Redskins won at least seven games for their fourth straight season and tied the last such streak that took place between a four-year span from 1999-2002. The team started out 6-3 and was 2-0 against the NFC East before losing starting quarterback Alex Smith to a season-ending leg injury.

In 2017 the Redskins won at least seven games for a third straight season. Gruden's team reached seven wins despite dealing with substantial injuries throughout the season, as 72 different players appeared in game action for the squad. A year earlier Gruden guided the Redskins to an 8-7-1 record in 2016 giving the franchise back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1996-97.

In 2015 Gruden led the Redskins to an NFC East Championship posting a 9-7 record to complete the second "worst-to-first" turnaround in team history.

Gruden assumed control of the Redskins in 2014 and guided the team through a campaign in which three different quarterbacks (Robert Griffin III, Kirk Cousins and Colt McCoy) recorded victories as starters.

Before joining the Redskins, Gruden spent his previous three seasons as offensive coordinator for the Cincinnati Bengals. Prior to joining the Bengals, Gruden served two years with the Florida Tuskers of the United Football League from 2009-10.

Gruden coached seven seasons (2002-08) with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, earning a Super Bowl championship ring as an offensive assistant in 2002.

Gruden also ranks among the most outstanding players and coaches in the history of the Arena Football League having won six combined league championships - four as a quarterback and two as a head coach. Gruden played quarterback (2002-03) and served as head coach (2004-08) of the AFL's Orlando Predators while simultaneously working as an offensive assistant with the Buccaneers.

★ WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN WEEK 2 ★

DAK PRESCOTT

- * Recorded his 33rd win versus the Giants, passing Craig Morton for sixth all-time in Cowboys history. Prescott trails only Tom Brady (36) for most wins since the start of 2016.
- * Obtained 1,500 attempts (1,507) and 1,000 completions (1,000), becoming the fastest Cowboys quarterback to 1,000 completions (49 games) and qualifying for NFL quarterback all-time rankings.
- * Ranks fifth all-time in QB Rating (97.4) and fourth all-time in TD/INT ratio (2.84).
- * Tied the NFL record for the most games with a 100.0 quarterback rating in a player's first three seasons (24) from 2016-18, and with a 158.3 rating against the Giants in Week 1 of 2019, became one-of-four players in NFL history to record a game with 400 passing yards, four passing touchdowns and a perfect passer rating, and only the second Cowboys quarterback to record a perfect rating in team history.
- * With 282 yards passing at Washington, can break the Cowboys record for most yards in the first two games of a season (Tony Romo, 687 in 2011).

EZEKIEL ELLIOTT

- * Became the 11th player, fifth since the merger (first Dallas Cowboy), to win the league rushing title at least twice in a player's first three seasons.
- * Needs one rushing touchdown to reach 30 in his career - tying Walt Garrison for seventh in team history.
- * Is one-of-four players to record 5,000 scrimmage yards in his first 40 NFL games (5,247 - second), joining Edgerrin James (5,627), Eric Dickerson (5,202) and Arian Foster (5,003). With 90 scrimmage yards on Sunday he can pass Eric Dickerson for the second-most scrimmage yards in 42 career games (5,399).

AMARI COOPER

- * Caught six passes for 106 yards and a touchdown in the season opener. Combined with Michael Gallup's 158 yards, the two became just the fourth pair of Cowboys teammates to post 100-plus receiving yards in the opening game of the season (Tony Hill/Doug Cosbie, 9/13/82; Michael Irvin/Rocket Ismael, 9/12/99; Keyshawn Johnson/Antonio Bryant, 9/12/04).
- * Surpassed 4,000 career receiving yards (4,014) in Week 1 against the Giants.

MICHAEL GALLUP

- * Caught seven passes for 158 yards - both career bests - in the season-opening win over the N.Y. Giants - the third-highest opening day receiving total in Cowboys history, and the second-most by any receiver in Week 1.
- * Needs 130 receiving yards to break the Cowboys record for most yards in the first two games of a season (Miles Austin, 288 in 2010).

JASON WITTEN

- * With an appearance in the game against the Giants, Witten became the longest tenured Cowboys player, playing in his 16th NFL season with Dallas.
- * Needs one touchdown reception to reach 70 for his career, and with four, would tie Dez Bryant (73) for the most in Cowboys history.

DEMARCUS LAWRENCE

- * Lawrence led the team with 10.5 sacks in 2018, marking the first time a Dallas defender recorded consecutive double-digit sack seasons since DeMarcus Ware (2007-11).
- * Needs 5.5 sacks to become the 11th Cowboys defender to reach 40.0 in a career.
- * DeMarcus Lawrence has recorded 25.5 sacks since the start of the 2017 season - fifth in the NFL during that span behind only Aaron Donald (31.5), Chandler Jones (31.0), Ryan Kerrigan (26.0) and Cameron Jordan (26.0).

55

LEIGHTON VANDER ESCH

- * Established a franchise rookie record with a team-leading 176 tackles. Also was only the sixth rookie to reach 100 tackles in a season. It was the fourth-highest tackle tally by any Dallas defender in a single season.
- * Set a single-game rookie team record with 19 tackles.
- * Needs 15 tackles to reach 200 for his career. Since 1977 when coaching film was first used to grade tackles, the fastest Cowboys defender to 200 career tackles is Dexter Coakley, who reached the milestone in 24 games.

CHRIS JONES

- * Jones ranks third all-time in percentage of punts downed inside the 20-yard line, at 40.19%
- * Needs one punt downed inside the 20-yard line to pass Mike Saxson (166) for sole possession of second place in Cowboys history.

★ FIRST TIME, LAST TIME ★

The first time these two clubs met, the Dallas Cowboys were just three weeks old and lost their first two games. Dallas headed to Washington on Oct. 9, 1960 for its first-ever road contest, and lost 26-14 in front of 21,142 fans.

The last time these two clubs met was Thanksgiving Day in 2018, and Amari Cooper was just four weeks into his Cowboys tenure when he roasted the Redskins secondary for eight catches and 180 yards, including a season-long 90-yard touchdown. Dallas won the game 31-22, splitting the season series with Washington.

★ WINNING HEAD COACH ★

For the first time as a head coach, and first time for the franchise since 2007-09, the Dallas Cowboys posted three consecutive winning seasons following a 10-6 finish in 2018.

Under Garrett's direction, the team secured its second NFC East divisional title with a 13-3 record in 2016, and he was named AP Coach of the Year. He also had an 11-game win streak to establish the longest single-season win streak in franchise history. Garrett won his 50th regular season game at Green Bay (10/16/16) to become only the second head coach in franchise history to reach 50 wins. He tied his personal best with the club's 12th win of the season against Tampa Bay (12/18/16) - tied for the second-most wins by a Cowboys head coach. It also marked Garrett's second 12-win season to give him the third-most 12-plus win seasons by a Dallas head coach. He then bettered his personal-best with his 13th win against Detroit (12/26/16), while tying Jimmy Johnson (1992) and Wade Phillips (2007) for the most wins by a Cowboys head coach in a single season.

Garrett wrapped up the 2014 regular season with a record of 12-4 - the fifth coach to reach 12 wins-or-better in a season in team history. He also secured his first NFC East Division title as the head coach. Against the N.Y. Giants (10/19/14), Garrett passed former head coaches Bill Parcells and Phillips with his 35th regular season win to place fourth in team history. He passed Barry Switzer for third with his 41st victory at Washington (12/28/14), then moved into second over Johnson (44) at Washington (12/7/15).

Including his 1-0 record in 2019, Garrett's current regular season record as the head coach of the Dallas Cowboys stands at 78-59, with the second-most wins all-time in team history:

★ GETTING TO FIVE HUNDRED ★

The Dallas Cowboys notched the franchise's 500th regular season win after a victory at the N.Y. Giants (12/10/17). Dallas reached that mark in 879 games, second-fastest all-time in NFL history only to Chicago's league-best 863 games. The win also served as Jerry Jones' 250th regular season win as the Dallas Cowboys Owner, President and General Manager:

★ ALL IN THE FAMILY ★

For the second straight season, the Dallas Cowboys were 5-1 against the NFC East in 2018 - 10-2 the last two seasons (2017-18) - and won the division for the 20th time since 1970. Dallas opened the 2019 season with a familiar foe in the N.Y. Giants, the seventh time in 11 years the two teams met in the first game at AT&T Stadium. Dallas won the first matchup of the year in decisive fashion, upping its win streak over the Giants to five games, and heads to Washington in Week 2 to take on the Redskins. The last time the Cowboys opened the year with back-to-back division games was in 2016.

★ SOLD OUT STADIUMS ★

The Cowboys have played in front of sold out stadiums in 474 of their last 476 games (including playoffs) and in 276 consecutive games. They played in front of sold out crowds in 153 consecutive games at Texas Stadium (including playoffs) - dating back to Dec. 16, 1990 against Phoenix, their last home non-sellout. Dallas opened what is now named AT&T Stadium with the largest crowd to witness a regular season NFL game with 105,121 tickets distributed and have 85 straight sellouts (including playoffs). The Cowboys have sold out each of their last 238 home games.

On the road, Dallas has played in front of sold out crowds in 135 straight games (including playoffs), dating back to its last road non-sellout - at Arizona (10/20/02).





★ THE BOOK OF EZEKIEL ★

For only the second time in franchise history, the Dallas Cowboys used a top-five pick on a running back when they chose Ezekiel Elliott out of Ohio State with the fourth overall selection in the 2016 NFL Draft. Dallas selected Tony Dorsett with the second pick in the 1977 NFL Draft.

After earning the NFL's rushing title as a rookie in 2016 with 1,631 yards, Elliott finished 10th in 2017 with 983 yards before once again leading the league in rushing in 2018 with 1,434 yards.

In his first season, Elliott produced seven 100-yard rushing games - most by a Cowboys rookie, tied for seventh by a league rookie all-time and tied for the most in the NFL in 2016. He added five more 100-yard outings in 2017, and with seven in 2018, he owns 19 for his career to tie for third all-time in team history.



★ DIVIDING UP THE PIE ★

In 2018 the Dallas Cowboys offense compiled 5,859 gross yards. Of that offensive pie, Ezekiel Elliott took up a sizeable portion of Dallas' offense. In fact, his 2,001 yards were equivalent to 34 percent of the Cowboys offensive output:

Elliott's 77 receptions were the most all-time by a Dallas running back - first time a running back has led the team in receptions since Richie Anderson in 2003 - while his 567 yards were fourth and his three touchdowns tied for sixth:



★ FLYING THE COOP ★

Amari Cooper set career-highs against Philadelphia (12/9/18) with 217 receiving yards and three touchdowns on 10 receptions (tied for third in his career) and for the second time of the season, was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for Week 14. His 217 receiving yards were the most by any NFL receiver in 2018, and the most since Julio Jones logged 253 yards against Tampa Bay (11/26/17).

His previous season-high came a few weeks prior against Washington (11/22/18) when he led the team with eight receptions for 180 yards and two touchdowns. Cooper's 180 receiving yards were the most by a Cowboys receiver on Thanksgiving Day, and were the most by a Cowboys receiver at the time since Dez Bryant had 224 against New Orleans (12/23/12). He was named the NFC's Offensive Player of the Week for Week 12 for his performance.

In nine games after acquiring Cooper, the former fourth overall pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, he tied for the fourth-most receiving first downs (39) and fourth-most receiving touchdowns (six), had the eighth-most receptions (53) and ninth-most receiving yards (725) to lead the team and rank amongst the top-10 of all NFL wide receivers from Weeks 9-17:



★ THE CONVERTER ★

The Dallas Cowboys signed Randall Cobb in 2019 free agency as they looked for ways to add a spark to their offensive attack, and in his first game with Dallas he did not disappoint. Cobb caught four passes for 69 yards with a 25-yard touchdown. Cobb kept several drives alive with his receptions, converting a first down on all four of his catches - something he was known for in his time with Green Bay. Including the first game of 2019, Cobb has converted 58.6% of his career receptions for first downs and has been ever better on third down, converting 74% of his third down receptions for a first down. 

Already placing in the top-two in career receptions and receiving yards all-time among league tight ends, Jason Witten is moving up the NFL's all-time receptions and receiving yards charts among all position players. Witten opened 2017 ranked seventh in receptions (1,089) and 27th in receiving yards (11,888).

He surpassed Tim Brown (1,094) for sixth on the league's all-time receptions list against the N.Y. Giants (9/10). At Denver (9/17) Witten moved up to fourth past Cris Carter (1,101) and Marvin Harrison (1,102).

Amongst league receiving yards leaders in 2017, Witten topped Derrick Mason (12,061) and Hines Ward (12,083) for 24th against Green Bay (10/8), Charlie Joiner (12,146) for 23rd at San Francisco (10/22), Brandon Marshall (12,215) for 22nd at Atlanta (11/12) and Jimmy Smith (12,287) for 21st against the LA Chargers (11/23):

★ THAT'S A BUNCH OF WITT ★

After coming into the league as Dallas' third round draft pick in 2003, Jason Witten has strung together a Hall of Fame career. He has appeared in the most Pro Bowls by a Cowboys tight end (11, seven consecutive - 2004-10 and three consecutive 2012-14 and in 2017), is tied for the most by any Dallas player in team history and is tops on the club's all-time receptions and receiving yards charts. In 2012 he took the top spot on the club's receptions chart from Michael Irvin at Atlanta (11/4). Witten took 151 games to reach the top of the team's receptions chart which was faster than Irvin (159). When compared to the two other NFL tight ends with at least 750 catches - Tony Gonzalez and Shannon Sharpe - Witten also reached the mark faster - Gonzalez (163 games), Sharpe (169).

He surpassed 1,000 career receptions at Washington (12/7/15) with five catches against the Redskins, reaching that mark in his 203rd game to become the sixth-fastest NFL player to do so, and the fastest tight end.

In 2012 Witten notched a club-record 18-catch game against the N.Y. Giants (10/28). His 18 receptions tied for third in a game in NFL history and were the most by a tight end in league history:



★ WOLF HUNTER ★

The Dallas Cowboys used their 2018 first round draft selection (19th overall) on Boise State linebacker Leighton Vander Esch. Vander Esch became the first rookie in team history to lead the team in tackles (since 1977) with 176 stops while starting 11-of-16 games played. He is only the sixth rookie to reach 100 tackles in a season - and registered the highest total by a rookie in a single season, dating back to 1977 when the stat started to be tracked by Dallas coaches film:

It was the first time Dallas has had at least two defenders with over 100 tackles in a season since 2016 when the unit finished with four players over the century mark:

★ THE PREDATOR ★

Jaylon Smith has cemented himself as one of the core pieces of the Dallas Cowboys defense with his speed and ferocity at the linebacker position. Smith had a career-best 2018 season, totaling 150 tackles and also blitzing opposing quarterbacks with 4.0 sacks in the process. Smith played 95.3% of the defensive snaps for Dallas in 2018 just three years removed from a knee injury that almost ended his career. He is the first Cowboys linebacker to record 150 tackles and at least 4.0 sacks since Keith Brooking in 2009:


