## THE NUMBERS

Dallas has the longest active streak in the NFL with multiple takeaways, forcing two-or-more turnovers in nine straight contests. The streak is tied for the second-longest in team history.

The Dallas Cowboys record against opponents in the AFC is 105-84 since the NFL merger in 1970, the second-most wins and the highest winning percentage (.556) by an NFC club.

The Cowboys are one-of-two teams with multiple 200-yard rushing performances in 2021 (Cleveland, two games) and currently have a two-game streak that is tied for the longest in team history (eight previous occurrences).

#### ★ DALLAS COWBOYS 2021 SCHEDULE 7

The Cowboys schedule currently features five games that will be broadcast nationally in primetime, including two from AT&T Stadium. In addition to the two primetime games at AT&T Stadium one on ESPN and one on NBC - and the club's annual Thanksgiving Day national appearance (this year on CBS), the Cowboys will make three national appearances in primetime on the road, one on NBC Thursday night, one on NBC's Sunday Night Football, and once on Thursday night on Fox/NFL Network/Amazon.

The Cowboys play five games against teams that qualified for the 2020 playoffs - Kansas City, New Orleans, Tampa Bay and Washington (twice). Additionally, for the 19th time in the organization's history, second consecutive, the Cowboys will open and close the season on the road. This will be fifth time in the last 11 years Dallas opens and closes the year away (2011, 2012, 2018, 2020).

This season marks the seventh time - second time in the last three seasons - that the Cowboys will face both Super Bowl participants from the previous season:



## Player Spotlight

## 7 TREVON DIGGS

Trevon Diggs is the second Cowboys defender to record an interception in each of the first five games of a season (Don Bishop, 1961). The longest INT streak to start a season in NFL history is six consecutive games, and Diggs became the 11th player ever to record a five-game streak with his pick against the N.Y. Giants:

- O Dallas and Buffalo are the only teams yet to allow an opposing quarterback to record a 100.0 passer rating through five games in 2021.
- 8 New England has scored a touchdown on eight-of-51 drives in 2021, a touchdown scoring efficiency of 15.7% that is tied for 30th in the NFL. Additionally, they are one-of-four teams to have yet to score a touchdown on drives that start at-or-inside their own 20-yard line.
- Dak Prescott leads all NFL passers with 10 touchdown tosses on blitz passing situations in 2021, posting a passer rating of 107.9 when pressured. The Patriots have held opposing quarterbacks to one passing score and a passer rating of 76.7 when blitzing this season.





#### $\star$ WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN WEEK 6 $\star$

#### **DAK PRESCOTT**

- Dak Prescott has thrown three-or-more touchdowns in three consecutive games. With three touchdown passes against New England, Prescott will become the first player in Cowboys history to record four straight three touchdown games.
- \* Prescott has recorded eight career 400-yard passing games, most in franchise history and tied with Carson Palmer for 10th all-time in league history With one more 400-yard performance he would tie Eli Manning and Aaron Rodgers for eighth in NFL history.
- \* Prescott is second in the NFL with a 73.9% completion rate, which is the highest completion percentage in franchise history through the first five games of a season.

#### **TREVON DIGGS**

- \* Trevon Diggs has intercepted a pass in each of the first five games of 2021, joining Don Bishop (1961) as the only players in team history to pick off a pass in each of the first five contests. With an interception on Sunday, Diggs would tie an NFL record at six consecutive games with an interception to start a season, joining Tom Landry (1951), Brian Russell (2003) and Barry Wilburn (1987).
- \* Trevon Diggs has nine interceptions in just 17 career games, becoming one-of-three cornerbacks in NFL history to record nine picks in his the first 17 games of a career and the first since former Cowboys cornerback Everson Walls recorded 11 interceptions through his first 17 games (1981-82).
- \* In addition to taking the ball away, Diggs has proven to be effective in coverage. According to *PFF*, Diggs has played the most coverage snaps (205) this season without allowing a touchdown. He has also allowed a league-low 38.9 passer rating against opposing quarterbacks, according to *PFF*.

#### **AMARI COOPER**

- \* With a 100-yard performance against the N.Y. Giants, Amari Cooper would move into a tie for eighth in franchise history for the most 100-yard receiving games (12).
- \* Cooper, who has recorded 474 career receptions, is closing in on 500 catches in his seventh NFL season. The only other Cowboy to notch 500 receptions in his first seven seasons is Jason Witten, who caught 523 from 2003-09.

#### **EZEKIEL ELLIOTT**

- \* Ezekiel Elliott has 1,498 career rushing attempts and needs three carries to surpass Don Perkins (1,500) for third in team history. Elliott would become the 15th player in NFL history to record 1,500 rushing attempts in the first 77 games of a career and the first since Clinton Portis had 1,566 carries through his first 77 games (2002-07).
- \* With one more receiving touchdown, Elliott will tale sole possession of fourth in team history for the most career receiving touchdowns by a Cowboys running back (12), surpassing Timmy Newsome, Preston Pearson and Emmitt Smith.
- \* With a 100 scrimmage yard game against New England, Elliott would surpass Michael Irvin for sole possession of third place in team history with 48 games of 100-plus scrimmage yards.
- \* Elliott has rushed for 100 yards in back-to-back contests. With another 100-yard performance on Sunday, Elliott would post three straight games with 100 rushing yards for the first time since 2019 (10/30/19 11/4/19).

#### **DALTON SCHULTZ**

\* Dalton Schultz has caught six passes in four of the first five games of 2021, joining Jason Witten as the only tight ends in Cowboys history to tally at least six receptions in four of the first five games of a season. Witten did this three times in his career, most recently in 2011.

#### **CEEDEE LAMB**

\* CeeDee Lamb, who has 98 career receptions in 21 games, can tie Herschel Walker as the fastest player in team history to reach 100 career receptions at 22 games.

#### **DALLAS COWBOYS**



- \* The Cowboys have posted 200 team rushing yards in back-to-back games for the ninth time in team history and the first since 2019. With 200 yards on the ground against New England, the 2021 Cowboys would set a franchise record for the most consecutive 200-yard rushing games (three).
- \* Dallas has notched multiple takeaways in nine consecutive games, dating back to Week 14 of 2020, which is the longest active streak in the NFL. With two-or-more takeaways on Sunday, it would tie a franchise record for consecutive games with multiple takeaways (10). The only other times this happened was in 1970-71 & 1976-77.
- \* Dallas has intercepted 10 passes through the first five games of 2021, tied for seventh-most through the first five games in team history and the most since the 2007 Cowboys picked off 10 passes in the first five games.
- \* The Cowboys have not started 5-1 since 2016 when the team finished the regular season 13-3 and advanced to the NFC Divisional Round of the playoffs.



## **★ WINNING HEAD COACH ★**

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 6-10 record in 2020 and a 4-1 start to 2021, he owns the sixth-most wins (29th all-time) and eighth-highest winning percentage among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason nine times, won six NFC North Division titles, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

McCarthy vs. NFL

#### **★ HEAD COACHES ★**

#### MIKE McCARTHY (135-88-2, 15th Year, 10-11 with Dallas)

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2020, handing the reigns of the team to an innovative offensive mind with a championship pedigree.

McCarthy has 14 years of head coaching experience – 13 with Green Bay and one with Dallas – along with 13 years as an assistant coach in the NFL, including six as an offensive coordinator.

As a head coach, McCarthy has racked up a 135-88-2 regular season coaching record, and he owns the sixth-most wins (27th all-time) among active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason nine times, won six NFC North Division titles, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship held at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, following the 2010 NFL season.

In his first season with the Cowboys, McCarthy's plan to install a new culture in Dallas was halted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Due to COVID protocols, McCarthy's first offseason with the Cowboys included no in-person meetings or practices. When the 2020 season came around, McCarthy's challenges continued. He watched his franchise quarterback Dak Prescott suffer a devastating season-ending injury in Week 5, along with having to implement eight different starting offensive line combinations due to injuries up front. Despite the hurdles, the 2020 Dallas Cowboys were in position to win the NFC East entering Week 17 but came up just short.

During his time in Green Bay, McCarthy was known as a prolific offensive mind and the primary play-caller for the Packers. McCarthy's offense finished fourth in the NFL in total offense and third in points-per-game through his 14-year stint with the club.

McCarthy is only the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight or more consecutive playoff appearances, joining Tom Landry, Chuck Noll and Bill Belichick. Those eight appearances from 2009-16 were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined over that span (Minnesota, three; Detroit, three; Chicago, one).

McCarthy's nine playoff appearances overall are the most by a Packers coach since the NFL postseason began in 1933, and he guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, McCarthy surpassed Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most playoff victories in team history (10).

#### BILL BELICHICK (282-139, 27th Year, 246-95 with NE)

Bill Belichick, one of the most accomplished coaches in NFL history, is in his 22nd season as head coach of the New England Patriots. Belichick accepted the job on Jan. 27, 2000, with a franchise that previously had no Super Bowl championships.

Belichick is the only head coach in league history to win six Super Bowl titles. Belichick won his last Super Bowl in 2018, joining George Halas and Curly Lambeau as the only NFL coaches with six championships. Belichick has also won nine conference championships, 17 AFC East crowns and won at least 11 regular season games 17 different times in his head coaching career, extending his NFL record in all categories.

Belichick entered 2021 with the most wins among all active coaches and recently became the third coach in NFL history to reach 300 total victories (regular season and postseason). His winning percentage of .669 ranks third in NFL history among coaches with at least 150 wins. He led the Patriots to a winning record for 19 consecutive seasons (2001-19) before a 7-9 record in 2020 broke the streak. The only other head coach with more consecutive winning seasons was Tom Landry, who recorded 20 consecutive winning seasons with the Cowboys from 1966-85. Belichick has notched 31 postseason wins in his career, most by a head coach in league history.

In his 47th season, Belichick holds the NFL mark for most consecutive seasons as an NFL coach. Belichick began his coaching career as a staff assistant with the Baltimore Colts in 1975 after graduating from Wesleyan University. He was named special assistant to Head Coach Ted Marchibroda at the age of 23. The following season, Belichick joined the Detroit Lions as an assistant special teams coach. In 1977 he was promoted to the tight ends and receivers coach for Detroit. After two seasons with Detroit, Belichick became the assistant special teams coach and assistant to defensive coordinator Joe Collier for the Denver Broncos.

He spent 12 seasons with the New York Giants (1979-90) before becoming head coach of the Cleveland Browns from 1991-95. He then joined the Patriots as assistant head coach/secondary coach under Bill Parcells for the 1996 season and left for the New York Jets the following season for the same title, where he served for three seasons. Belichick returned to New England in 2000 as head coach and turned the Patriots into the winningest NFL franchise of the 21st century thus far.

All 11 of Dallas' draft picks made the initial 53-man roster (Kelvin Joseph and Josh Ball were placed on Reserve/Injured after making the initial 53), the second-consecutive year that Dallas had all its draft choices make the team out of training camp, and the eighth time since 1989.

The Cowboys did not have a rookie free agent player from 2021 make the initial roster, the first time there have been no undrafted free agents make the team since 2016.

Since 2010 Dallas has selected 13 players that have gone on to make at least one Pro Bowl - tied for the third-most in the NFL over that span (Kansas City, 15; Minnesota, 14; Baltimore/Seattle, 13). 




## PASSING DEPTH CHART

## **★ TOUCHDOWN-TO-INTERCEPTION RATIO ★**

Dak Prescott has shown prolific decision making in the young stages of his career, throwing only 43 interceptions against 119 touchdown passes. Prescott also knows when to tuck the ball and attack with his legs, scoring an additional 24 touchdowns on the ground in his five-plus NFL seasons. Among all qualifying quarterbacks (1,500 pass attempts), Prescott ranks sixth all-time with a 2.77 touchdown/interception ratio, and he is one-of-three quarterbacks in league annals to record fewer than 50 interceptions on at least 2,000 pass attempts (2,458 att., 43 int.), joining Nick Foles (2,010 attempts and 43 interceptions) and Case Keenum (2,101 attempts and 47 interceptions).

#### KING EZEKIEL

After leading the league in rushing as a rookie in 2016, Ezekiel Elliott finished 10th in the NFL in 2017 despite missing six games. He once again won the NFL rushing title in 2018 and finished fourth in 2019. He finished 2020 10th in rushing among running backs, 11th overall, and in 2021 he ranks third in the NFL.

#### THE BOOK OF EZEKIEL

For only the second time in franchise history, the Dallas Cowboys used a top-five pick on a running back when they chose Ezekiel Elliott out of Ohio State with the fourth overall selection in the 2016 NFL Draft. Dallas selected Tony Dorsett with the second pick in the 1977 NFL Draft.

In his first season, Elliott produced seven 100-yard rushing games - most by a Cowboys rookie all-time and tied for the most in the NFL in 2016. He owns 30 for his career to rank third all-time in team history.







Dallas exploited defenses for the 11th-most yards after the catch in the NFL in 2020 with 2,053 YAC - 45.5% of their total passing output (4,511 gross yards). The YAC total was the sixth-most by a Cowboys offense since 1992 when the stat began to be tracked, with the highest figure coming in 2009 (2,340). Dallas is off to a fast start in 2021 with 655 YAC - 13th in the league:



#### **★ 11 PERSONNEL ★**

With the Cowboys having three game-breaking options at the wide receiver position, they relied heavily on their "11 personnel" (one running back, one tight end and three receivers) in 2020 - ranking fifth among all teams by running 71.5% of their offensive snaps from that formation grouping:

After ranking fifth in the NFL with a touchdown on 27.4% of their 174 offensive drives in 2019, the Cowboys took a step back in 2020, averaging a touchdown on 21.7% of 180 drives. Over the last five years (2016-2020), Dallas ranks eighth in offensive touchdown percentage, driving for six on 24.3% of possessions, something the offense will need to improve in its drive for a sixth Super Bowl Championship:

#### $\star$ 4TH DOWN CONVERSIONS $\star$

In 2020 Head Coach Mike McCarthy proved to be one of the more aggressive coaches in the NFL. The Cowboys led the NFL with 31 fourth down attempts, a franchise record and the most McCarthy has attempted in his 15-year career. Dallas' 17 conversions are also a franchise record, and its 54.8% conversion rate is the highest since 2018.

Parsons dons his signature "11" jersey number from Penn State, where he followed in the footsteps of Nittany Lion greats Lavar Arrington, NaVorro Bowman and Brandon Bell as linebackers to wear that number in college.

### **★** STIX CITY ★

The Cowboys drafted Micah Parsons with the 12th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft, adding a fast play maker to a defense that finished 28th in points/game allowed in 2020.

Parsons is proving to be a versatile chess piece for the Cowboys, playing 62 run defense snaps, 97 pass rush snaps and 87 pass coverage snaps in 2021. Pro Football Focus has credited Parsons with 21 quarterback pressures on the season - tied for 12th in the NFL - largely due to eight pressures in Week 2 at the LA Chargers, a game in which Parsons moved from linebacker to defensive end because of injuries to other players on the Cowboys roster.

Parsons' eight pressures credited from *PFF* at the LA Chargers are the most by a rookie in a game since Nick Bosa in 2019, and he is generating a pressure on 20.2% of his rush opportunities.



Trevon Diggs was named NFC Defensive Player of the Month for September, becoming just the hitrd Cowboys defender and first defensive back to win the award for Dallas.

Diggs was a lock-down corner through three September games for Dallas, helping the Cowboys to a league-leading plusfive turnover differential and NFL-best eight takeaways in the opening month of 2021. Diggs tied for the NFL-lead with three interceptions - matching his career-high from his rookie campaign in 2020, and led all defensive players with six pass breakups in September. In the Week 3 Monday Night Football game against division rival Philadelphia, Diggs returned an interception 59 yards for a touchdown to break open the game, also registering three breakups in the contest and holding Jalen Hurts to a 36.8 passer rating when targeted.

He registered an interception in each of the first three games of the season, tied with Everson Walls (1985) for the longest streak to start a season in Cowboys history since the 1970 merger.

Dallas also ranked 10th in passing yards-per-game with 277.3, at the conclusion of September largely on the strength of Diggs' play.

Embedded in the Carolina performance were three rookie defenders who recorded at least a partial sack for the Cowboys, the first time Dallas had three rookies record a sack stat in the same game since DeMarcus Ware (1.0), Chris Canty (0.5) and Jay Ratliff (0.5) at Oakland (10/2/05):

#### **★ I'LL TAKE THAT ★**

The Dallas defense forced four takeaways in Week 1 against Tom Brady and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, tying its single-game high from a season ago (at Phi, 11/1/20 and vs. SF, 12/20/20).

Included in those four takeaways were two interceptions off Brady, his most in a game since 2020 at Kansas City (11/29/20).

The Cowboys finished last season with a -3 turnover differential, tied for 21st in the league, and had a 2-7 record in games that they posted an even or negative turnover margin.

Dallas ranks second with a +7 turnover differential in 2021, and when the team posted a positive turnover margin in 2020, it finished with a 4-3 record.

#### $\star$ TAKEAWAYS IN BUNCHES $\star$

The Cowboys recorded 16 takeaways (nine fumble recoveries, seven interceptions) in the second half of the 2020 season after recording only seven takeaways in the first eight games of the season. Dallas finished the year with a takeaway in seven straight games, its longest streak with a takeaway since a ninegame streak to close the 2018 season.

Dallas has continued to pilfer the football in 2021, recording 12 takeaways through five games - second in the NFL - and tied for the fourth with two red zone takeaways. The takeaways have not only limited opponent scoring but have lead to points for the Cowboys on 62.5% of drives after takeaways (five-of-eight):

Greg Zuerlein had two game-winning kicks for the Cowboys in 2020, first against Atlanta (9/20/20) with a game-winning 46-yard field goal and then against the N.Y. Giants (10/11/20). Zuerlein capped off the Cowboys first victory of the 2021 season with his third game-winning field goal as a Cowboy - 11th career game-clinching kick - booting a 56-yard kick as time expired at the LA Chargers:

The kick to beat the Chargers was the second-longest game-winner of Zuerlein's career - longest regular season kick - and Zuerlein's 57-yard game-winning kick in the NFC Conference Championship game in 2018 is the longest game-winning field goal in postseason history.

Zuerlein is nine-of-11 on field goals in 2021, and he is one-oftwo from 50-plus yards. He ranks fourth in the NFL with 44 kicking points.

Zuerlein finished three-of-nine from 50-plus in 2020 and connected on 34-of-41 field goals overall, tied with Richie Cunningham (1997) for the most made field goals in a single season in team history. He also tallied 135 points, tied for second-most in a single season in team history, and became the 60th kicker in NFL history to reach 1,000 career points (1,002).

#### **★ WATERMELON BALLS ★**

The Cowboys improbable Week 2 comeback win over Atlanta would not have been possible without Greg Zuerlein's "watermelon football" onside kick, a kick that sends the football spinning towards the receiving team. The Cowboys recovered the kick, a feat that has only happened 28 times out of 246 tries league-wide in the last five seasons (11.4% probability from 2017-21):




